Preble Painting LLC was a 20-year painting contracting business in Spokane, WA. At peak operations, the business employed 7-10 workers supporting approximately 7 families. Annual gross revenue was approximately \$60,000-\$72,000. The business carried normal operating debt: vehicle loans (4Runner for hauling materials, RZR for job site access), credit lines to float payroll between client payments, equipment financing, L&I premiums, and quarterly IRS obligations. All debt was sustainable and current at normal operating income.

Respondent has been liquidating personal property, tools, and equipment to service debts and fund bare survival. The IRS debt (\$60,000) accrued from prior profitable years when taxes were deferred to fund business growth and operations. L&I is now pursuing legal action for unpaid workers compensation premiums that were current when the business was operating. List your total lawyer fees and costs for this case as of today.

Respondent was lured back to Spokane to fight a forced sale of the family home to collect on a \$25,000 judgment that had already been overpaid. He was arrested at the courthouse doors. The protection order functions as a de facto eviction and economic ban from the region where respondent built his business and 20-year client base. He cannot live, work, or conduct business in Spokane without risk of arrest. The order destroyed a 20-year economic engine and converted \$257,000+ in manageable debt into catastrophe. Water is shut off at the home. \$16K needed to reinstate mortgage. This is not unwillingness. It is destruction.
